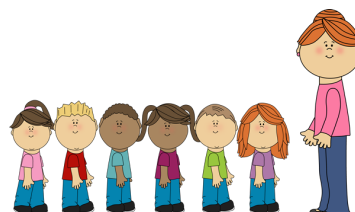

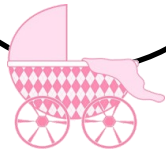


Middle Section News

We have had a busy start to the Term in the 3/4 Section.

Our theme for the Term is the History of Tatura. We are beginning with The First Fleet, Convicts, Explorers and the Discovery of Gold, before looking at Early Tatura.

In Writing we have been working on some holiday writing and Information Reports. This week we begin a unit on Poetry.

In Reading we are looking at Summarising Non Fiction Texts and beginning Figurative Language in Australian Poetry. We will be reading some Australian Poems to each other in class too.

In Maths students enjoyed using protractors when measuring angles and have learnt about right, obtuse and acute angles. We are now completing a unit on multiplication, using arrays, factors, number patterns, fact families and multiplication facts to solve word problems.

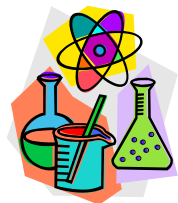

We have a number of initiatives on the go now to raise awareness around sustainable practices. Please familiarise yourself with these and find out how you can help to make our community a better place to live.

Mobile Muster

Mobile Muster is the Australian mobile phone industry's official product stewardship program funded voluntarily by most handset manufacturers and all network carriers. Since the telecommunications industry introduced its recycling service in 1998, MobileMuster has collected over 13 million mobile phones and batteries which have been kept out of landfill. This free recycling service enables everyone to play their part in keeping old mobiles out of landfill ensuring they are recycled in a safe, secure and ethical way. None of the items collected are re-sold for re-use.

The program accepts the following items for recycling: all brands of mobile phones and their batteries, chargers, accessories and mobile wireless broadband devices

Uniform Requirements

2019

Please ensure that your child is dressed appropriately for the weather conditions of the day.

A combination of the items below can be worn according to their comfort needs.

(Please note that girls must not wear trousers under the summer dress)

- Summer dress in school fabric blue/white check with navy thread
- School Shorts- navy blue
- Plain navy blue long trousers- gabardine or trackpants
- Skort- navy blue
- Short-sleeved polo shirt- navy blue & sky blue with school logo – (make – Winning Spirit, style PS31)
- Skivvy- navy blue
- Polo shirt specific to Grade 6 students
- Navy blue or white socks
- Navy blue tights
- Black school shoes/boots or all black school sneakers suitable for PE.
- Windcheater- navy blue with school logo
- Windbreaker jacket- navy blue with sky blue sleeve stripe with school logo
- A plain navy fleece jacket or sleeveless vest with school logo is an option to supplement the uniform in winter
- Hat- navy blue broad-brimmed/bucket (Terms 1 and 4)- optional school logo
- Navy blue beanie- optional school logo

Notes:

- All uniform, including hats, windcheaters and jackets must be named. Name tapes or machine embroidered names make the easiest identification.
- Variations of uniform (eg: netball skirts, leggings, coloured shoes, visible slogans on clothes) are not acceptable. Please ask at school if you are unsure.
- Students may wear gold/silver earring studs or sleepers or a watch. Girls may wear navy blue or sky blue hair accessories.
- Note that all uniform items are available from Tatura Logos and Promos. Parents are also able to purchase general navy clothing items that can then be embroidered at Tatura Logos and Promos.
